	Today's outing was a part of the Greenville County Spring Migration Count organized by JB Hines. 17 GCBC members and guests participated in the Spring Migration Count at Lake Conestee Nature Park. One of the guests came from Columbia, SC, another from Asheville, NC. Six of us started at the stadium entrance at 7 a.m. to check out the north lake before it gets disturbed by park visitors. Unfortunately, 2 fishermen were already there in canoes and there were not many birds on the lake. However, a Pied-billed Grebe and Palm Warbler were good birds to start our list. We joined the main group at the Spanco Drive trailhead at 8. 3 birders started at the Belmont FD to work the Fork Shoals Rd / Henderson Meadow section of the park. Because of the large number of participants we were able to split into smaller groups and cover almost all the trails in the park. We finished birding shortly after noon with a total list of 59 species – well short of last year's record total of 73, but the highest one-day total so far this year. The list included FOY birds Red-eyed Vireo and Great-crested Flycatcher. Migrants seem to be a little late arriving at Conestee this year – Indigo Bunting, Blue Grosbeak and several warbler species have yet to show up there. Adult birds were seen at both Red-shouldered Hawk nests and young birds were spotted on at least one of the two Great Blue heron nests.
