Greenville County Bird Club Trip Report

Date: October 20, 2007

Location: Lake Conestee Nature Park, Greenville County, SC

5 GCBC members and two guests birded Lake Conestee Nature Park this morning from 8 a.m. till noon. The weather was almost perfect for birding. We had a total of 38 species (complete list below), bringing the October list up to 71. There were 6 Wood Ducks on the lake, including 2 males in beautiful full breeding plumage. In the Park we saw two fair sized flocks of Mallards flying over the marsh area. There were about 30 to 40 birds, far more than I have observed recently in the Park. The warbler fall migration appears to be almost ended, although we did see 3 species: an immature Blackburnian Warbler, a Pine Warbler (probably a resident) and numerous Yellow-rumped Warblers (which will probably colonize the Park through the winter). Sparrow numbers are increasing. We saw 4 species today (5 counting Towhee): Field, Song, Swamp and White-throated. The Swamp Sparrow was the first recorded in the Park since May. A Brown Creeper was a welcome returning bird. The last record for the Park was back in March. A good morning's birding!
