Seventeen club members and guests met at Wilson Farm on a beautiful fall-like morning. Birding was slow with few migrants found, but we did have more bird species than birders. We saw or heard 34 species, including a female Scarlet Tanager.

After the group outing, two members and the two co-leaders went to another part of Wilson farm on Coleman Road and found an additional 12 species, including Golden-winged Warbler, Bay-breasted Warbler, White-eyed Vireo (singing), and Chimney Swift.
