## **Greenville County Bird Club Trip Report**

Date: January 19, 2008

**Location:** Lake Conestee Nature Park, Greenville SC

Leader: Paul Serridge

**Comments:** The weather forecast calling for drizzle turning to snow and

falling temperatures probably explained why only 2 GCBC members and a guest made the trip to Lake Conestee Nature

Park. Those who stayed home missed a pretty good

morning's birding. The north end of the lake yielded 3 new species for 2008: a lone Gadwall (only the second reported in the Park), 3 American Wigeons and a pair of Hooded Mergansers. There were also the expected Mallards and Ring-necked Ducks. Canada Geese and a Killdeer were heard

overhead.

Just after the start of the white trail going down from the Belmont Fire Department we spotted a Great Horned Owl,

bird # 146 for the Park.

On the trails we ran into a few pockets of birds. The highlights were excellent views of a Fox Sparrow (second report for the Park) foraging in the grasses near the main boardwalk at the junction of the red and blue trails, and a Hermit Thrush near the Reedy River Overlook.

Soon after we left the Observation Deck the rain became more persistent and we headed back to the trailhead at a rather brisk pace, stopping only once to watch a very cooperative White-breasted Nuthatch which seemed totally oblivious to the rain and cold.

In all we reported 34 species, which was a pretty good total considering the weather and the fact that we dipped on some of the more usual sightings including Bluebird, Brown Thrasher, Mourning Dove, Starling, Yellow-rumped Warbler and Flicker.
