8 GCBC members and 6 guests birded LCNP this morning. 4 of us started at the Forester Farm tract (before meeting the rest of the group at the trailhead) and reported Mallard, Wood Duck, Ring-necked Duck and Pied-billed Grebe at the north end of the lake. We also had the pleasure of watching a River Otter catch a fish in the lake and climb out of the water on to a dead log to consume it. From the overlook near the dam we saw a shape at the entrance to a Wood Duck nest box. Screech Owl? No, just a gray squirrel.

Despite the warm sunshine, birds were rather scarce on the trails but we managed to see and/or hear a total of 42 species (detailed list below) plus an Accipiter which was probably a Sharp-shinned Hawk. Interestingly, the February outing to LCNP last year yielded a very similar number, 43. From the Observation Deck we had brief looks at a Beaver swimming in the marsh. The two beaver dams appear to be getting more sturdy. We saw turtles sunning themselves on logs in the water and a couple of early butterflies. Spring is not too far away!
