	 15 GCBC members and 4 guests birded the Cottonwood, Wetlands and Beaver Dam Trails in the Edwin M. Griffin Nature Preserve in Spartanburg this morning. Temperatures steadily rose from the low 40s to low 60s and the weather was almost ideal for birding. Signs of the impending spring migration were sighting of a solitary Tree Swallow and the song of one or more Common Yellowthroats. We had excellent looks at Red-headed Woodpeckers and also at a Sharp-shinned Hawk from the boardwalk on the Wetlands Trail. The total species list for the morning is shown below (46 species). Please note that the club is scheduled to visit the Cottonwood Trail again later in the migration season on Saturday, May 24th. See the Outings page for details. The Preserve species list currently stands at 135 and includes 30 Warbler species. We hope to see some of them on the May outing.
