Cottonwood Trail. The recent rain had caused the creek to flood in the past few days and some of the trails were still under water. Nevertheless, on the dry trails we were able to

tally a total of 49 species (see list below).

The trail is one of the best places in the Upstate to observe Red-headed Woodpeckers and we were not disappointed, having good looks at 2 or more splendidly colored adult birds

from the boardwalk. In fact, we had 6 of the 7 possible

Woodpecker species.

Some winter species were still around such as Yellow-bellied

Sapsucker, Winter Wren and Pine Siskin.

New spring arrivals included Common Yellowthroat (several

birds singing) and Blue-gray Gnatcatcher.
