Greenville County Bird Club Trip Report

Date: June 30, 2013

Location: Blue Ridge Parkway north of Asheville

Three GCBC members enjoyed a very productive mid-summer day of birding along the Blue Ridge Parkway north of Asheville. Starting out at Craven Gap, we were able to find Kentucky Warblers as well as Hooded Warbler and Ovenbird. At milepost 375 and at the Bull Creek Valley Overlook, there were Cerulean Warblers still singing. At Bull Creek we also found the first of several Blackburnian Warblers for the day.

Farther up the Parkway at Craggy Gardens, we found Veery, Canada Warbler, and the first of the day's Golden-crowned Kinglets. At the Bald Knob Ridge trail and at Balsam Gap (Walker Knob), we found more kinglets along with other high-elevation species, such as Winter Wrens, singing Hermit Thrushes (several), Brown Creeper, and plenty more Blackburnian Warblers.

At Mount Mitchell, where we enjoyed a nice picnic lunch, we had good numbers of Pine Siskins flying over, and eventually looks at one perched atop a Spruce tree. On the trail to the tower at the top, we heard and then saw a singing Yellow-rumped Warbler! While this bird is painfully abundant in the Piedmont and coastal regions from fall to spring, it is quite a find in the middle of summer. Also at Mount Mitchell, we had a group of fly-over Red Crossbills, followed by another fly-over group at Ridge Junction Overlook.

We had a very enjoyable day and finished with a total of 65 species, including 11 warblers and 3 thrushes. The complete list is below.
