Eleven birders enjoyed a cool morning of birding. On the way to Dobbins Farm, we spotted Red-tailed and Cooper's Hawks working the fields and tree lines. At the farm, we found Savannah and Song Sparrows, Eastern Meadowlarks, Ring-necked Ducks and a Lesser Scaup, some fly-over American Pipits, and a distant Red-headed Woodpecker. Just down the road at Beaverdam Creek WMA, we spotted some Rusty Blackbirds, found both species of Kinglets, and had much better looks at Red-headed Woodpeckers, among many others. We had a great woodpecker day, finding all seven species that can be expected. White-throated, Swamp, and Field Sparrows were all found near the entrance to the WMA as well. Peering in from the edge of the WMA, now closed for hunting, we spotted more Ring-necked Ducks, Mallards, Canada Geese, and Pied-billed Grebes.

At the bridge on Fork School Road, we had a Song Sparrow with an aberrant song that threw us off for a while, along with a bunch more sparrows to sort through. From there we moved on to Prater Farm, where we picked up two more birders as well as Vesper, White-crowned, and House Sparrows, Eurasian Collared-Dove, and were flown over by a large flock of Pipits. We were not able to find the resident Barn Owl, but did find Loggerhead Shrike.

After lunch, a few members stopped by Townville Landing to check the lake, where Common Loons, American Coots, and Pied-billed Grebes, were located. Though spotted by the Keowee-Clemson Bird Club earlier in the day, we located no Horned Grebes. A few distant gulls- probably Ring-billed -were too far off to identify with certainty.
