## **Greenville County Bird Club Trip Report**

Seven GCBC members and three guests began the day at the West Bay because the East Bay was shrouded in mist.

Birding was a little slow at the start (Fish Crows, Starlings.....) but picked up after we crossed the Reedy River. Plenty of Mallards (definitely NOT the domestic variety) were discovered in the wetlands leading to the West Bay. Along the Heron Circle Trail, three Red-headed Woodpeckers were found.

At the observation deck the highlight was a couple of American Coots until one of the guests, a novice birder, asked "What is that brown bird?". Well...that "brown bird" was an American Bittern which was very active, at least by Bittern standards, as it foraged in full view. Wonderful!

We then went to the East Bay where a Ruddy Duck had joined the now common Ring-necked Ducks.

We moved on to Spanco Drive hoping to locate a few Rusty Blackbirds and were not disappointed, especially those for whom a Rusty was a life-bird. We found 40+ in the South Bay.
