Two separate trips were held, both starting at 8:00 a.m.

The longer trip (all morning) started at the ball-fields, birded the East Bay loop before car-pooling to Spanco and birding the trails back to the ball-fields.

The shorter trip (2.5 hours) met at Spanco, then carpooled to the Belmont FD, and birded the trails back to Spanco. Chip commented that it might have been better to have done it in reverse because of the direction of the sun.

It was unseasonably cold with a temperature of only 27 F at 8:00 a.m. It felt colder even though there was little wind. Twelve GCBC members and one guest (from Valdosta, GA) braved the low temperatures and enjoyed a productive morning's birding.

The combined lists (see below) show a total of 50 species. We did not see any of the hoped-for winter ducks. They should arrive soon.

Highlights were definitely the large flocks of Rusty Blackbirds seen by both groups, principally in the South Bay.





A Sharp-shinned Hawk was a nice find by Chip's group near the feeders, but its presence had understandably scared away other birds. Fortunately, it had left by the time Paul's group arrived and five Purple Finches were on the feeders (lifer for at least one participant). Sometimes it's better to be lucky than good!
