Location: Holliday Circle and Cedar Falls County Park, Greenville County

Eight GCBC members had a lovely outing this morning at Holliday Circle and Cedar Falls County Park, good weather, good birds and good company. Total of 44 species identified.

We walked the road on Holliday Circle that Brad had showed us last fall, running from a low creek to a field at the top of the hill. We had a total of 37 species on that small stretch, including great looks at a Louisiana Waterthrush that Paul called in twice! Unexpected sightings were a Double-crested Cormorant flyover and two Ospreys soaring off to the west. A look on Google maps shows there might be a dam downstream on the Saluda River providing good habitat.

We moved to Cedar Falls County Park, starting with good looks at a singing Chipping Sparrow in a Cedar tree in the parking lot. We spotted both Yellow-throated and Palm Warblers down by the falls and Paul, with his phone, managed to bring a Northern Parula to almost within hand's reach.

We made a quick stop at Gunter Road on the way back and discovered a Solitary Sandpiper in the cow pond.

Next weekend should be even better! Come out and help Brad beat our record ;-)
