Shorter Walk

5 GCBC members and 2 guests enjoyed a relatively quiet short walk this morning at Lake Conestee.

Highlights were two red-bellied woodpeckers in the south bay doing some fly-catching over the water before landing in the large tree by the parking lot, so that we could get a fairly good look at them. It was an adult and a juvenile.

We had a good look at a young great blue heron off the boardwalk near west bay.

Also a very large snapping turtle was resting just below the first observation deck down the trail from Spanco. Its head must have been 5"-6" across.
